

Soup Kitchen Wish List

- Spaghetti and elbow macaroni.
- Tomato paste and tomato sauce.
- We need to replenish our cotton kitchen cleaning cloths. (We have plenty of microfiber cloths.) We prefer the ribbed cotton towels called "bar mops" or "bar mop towels" which are about 16" x 19". It helps to have white towels so they can be bleached.
- Laundry soap, bleach, SOS pads, kitchen cleanser, dish-washing soap are always needed.
- People have asked, "why dish soap, when you have a dishwasher?" We have a low-temperature dishwasher, and this acts quite differently than a normal home dishwasher. Stubborn food and sticky things have to be scrubbed off prior to going through the dishwasher.
