Contributions to The Soup Kitchen can be a real deal!

Financial contributions to The Soup Kitchen can be a "real deal" due to special tax benefits . . . both State of Michigan and Federal . . . for donors. Here are examples of the tax benefits for financial charitable donations:

- 1. If couples filing jointly donate \$400, the Michigan tax credit is a maximum of \$200 (which means subtracting 200 - (50%) - from your tax payment). Assuming a Federal tax rate of 25%, the deduction is \$50. This is a combined total benefit of \$250 for a \$400 contribution to The Soup Kitchen
- 2. An individual tax payer that contributes \$200, gets a maximum \$100 Michigan tax credit, plus a \$25 Federal tax deduction . . . a total \$125 benefit.

At tax time, it's always advisable to consult your tax advisor.
