The September OSS Services Hometown Hero last was Soup Kitchen Volunteer Becky Payne. Becky was described by her nominator as "an amazing person who constantly gives back despite all she has been through."

Becky served in the US Army for three years, retiring as an E-5 Sergeant. She had planned to become an FBI agent after graduating Western Michigan University Thomas M. Cooley Law School. Becky had passed most of the necessary tests to begin her career in the FBI by 2002, but a hiring freeze occurred once the war started, halting her FBI aspirations. Instead, Becky became a Military Police officer. She served in Iraq in the US Army for 8 months. There were only two other females assigned to her unit.

While serving in Iraq, Becky survived two bombings. The first bomb faced the wrong way, which saved her life and those serving beside her. The second suicide bombing resulted in more destruction and casualties. On August 23, 2005, her unit members were finishing lunch when a suicide bomber blew himself up in the dining facility. The blast killed one officer, an Iraqi Policeman, and one civilian law enforcement official. Six soldiers were wounded.

Four feet away from the bomber, Becky grabbed her gun to stop him but didn't have time. Becky was so close to the suicide bomber that her wounds were cauterized, and she didn't even realize she was injured. Becky leaped into action, radioed for help, and tried to help as many people as possible.

Becky was flown to almost died at Walter Reed National Military Medical Facility. She remained in a coma for almost two weeks, but, after several operations, she survived.

Today, Becky works at the Berrien County Courthouse as a Central Assignment Assistant Supervisor, where she works with the judges, handling paperwork, bonds, and training clerks.

Becky serves once a month at the Benton Harbor Soup Kitchen, which she has done for the past four years. Every November and December, she gives personal hygiene bags to people living at the Salvation Army and guests in the Soup Kitchen. Becky said that helping people and talking to the guests is the most rewarding thing she does.




